Information for Emergency Planning in the Campbell Industrial Park Community

Continuing Challenge

The Honolulu Local Emergency Planning Committee (LEPC) has been funding the travel of Honolulu Fire Department (HFD) Hazmat personnel to the Continuing Challenge Hazardous Materials Workshop held annually in Sacramento, CA for the past several years. This workshop is considered the premier training workshop for hazardous materials responders in the Western United States, and affords hazmat personnel the opportunity to examine the latest technology in the fields of Hazardous Materials and Weapons of Mass Destruction.



CLEAN has provided a grant of \$8000 to the Honolulu LEPC to send an additional 5 HFD Hazmat personnel to the Continuing Challenge Workshop this

year, which will allow the entire hazmat leadership of the HFD to attend the workshop this year as a group. CLEAN's grant will help ensure that Campbell Industrial Park and the neighborhoods of Oahu are protected by a well trained and equipped Fire Department.



HPD Needs Your Help

Although the recent "unidentified tanker truck" episode on Olai Street turned out to be a non-event, the "what if's" behind that incident illustrate the importance of having an Evacuation Plan in place. If you need help in developing an Evacuation Plan for your business, refer to the CLEAN Resource Guide. On a larger scale, The Honolulu Police Department (HPD) is actively working on a Campbell Industrial Park (CIP) Evacuation Plan. A couple of things

that the HPD need to keep current are Employee Lists and samples of identification cards from CIP companies. Having these up-to-date will enable the HPD to regulate access to controlled areas during an evacuation, while minimizing disruption to critical business operations. When the situation calls for a mass evacuation, we do not want to expose more people to harm than necessary. Therefore, it will be helpful to annotate on your Employee List those individuals who are absolutely critical to either shutting down or keeping your operations running. The HPD asks for your *kokua*. Please submit, and continue to resubmit updated versions of your Employee List and a sample of your company identification card to Lt Daniel Ford of the HPD.

DDE Awarded Grant for Three Siren Simulators
